## *Local Civitan Clubs Celebrate 100 Years of Civitan International Service*

Civitan International was founded in 1917 by people who wanted to make a difference during World War I and although needs have changed, the philosophy continues today by practicing "all aspects of good citizenship". This is an all volunteer service association that spans the globe and we're fortunate enough to have three Clubs right here in New Bern! We hope you join the New Bern Civitans, the Tryon Civitans, and the We Can Civitans to help them celebrate Civitan International's 100th Anniversary!

Although they have the same mission, they provide different services throughout our community. Please get to know your local Clubs and consider joining, donating, and/or volunteering:

**The New Bern Civitan Club** which was established in 1956 has 115 active members. It meets 3 times per month – two lunches and one dinner get together. Our meetings are enlightening with community guest speakers who help keep us abreast with local and statewide important information.

This Club raises money for local charities with its yearly Christmas trees and wreaths sales, a gigantic Yard sale, benefit concerts and silent auctions. It monetarily donates to RCS, Merci Clinic, Family Literacy and Pre-School Program of Craven County, the Boys and Girls Club, Special Olympics, the Civitan International Research Center in Alabama and many others.

Moreover, this Club has many "hands-on" community projects including ramp building for the physically handicapped, a "Senior" prom for the disabled, a monthly dinner program for RCS Shelter residents and the RCS Soup Kitchen. We are very involved in Special Olympics programs including Field Day, Bowling and Basketball and we are active in the "Craven's Got Talent Program", which raises funds for NC Special Olympics.

Seasonally, we have an upcoming Kids in Canoes Program where some of our members take children from the Summer Recreation program and give them an on the water experience at Lawson Creek Park. In winter, we sponsor Santa Land from our tree lot where special children from the County's Pre-School program meet with Santa and receive pictures and gifts supplied by Club members. In spring, we have a Fishing Derby for the disabled.

The Club sponsors a Junior Civitan Club at New Bern High School. This year, we awarded eight scholarships to graduating seniors.

**The Tryon Civitan Club** was chartered in March of 1982 as an all female club with 89 members and their first male member joined in 1998. For over 35 years the Tryon Civitan Club has been turning the words in the Civitan Creed into actions; especially the part about "reaching out in service to others".

Tryon members also volunteer with Habitat for Humanity as well as our YMCA's Water Safety Programs and the MS Bike Ride. Several times during the year they hold community-wide food drives for Religious Community Services and the Salvation Army. And this August will be their 4th annual diaper drive, which they've named "No Child Wet Behind".

In addition to volunteering, the club makes monetary gifts to several local non-profits, some of which are the Coastal Women's Shelter, Merci Clinic and Interfaith Refugee Ministry. During the year the club has several fundraisers, including hosting a flapjack breakfast and selling poinsettias.

There is a great need for scholarship assistance for the veteran/active duty military affiliated student population. Many do not qualify for financial assistance for a variety of reasons.

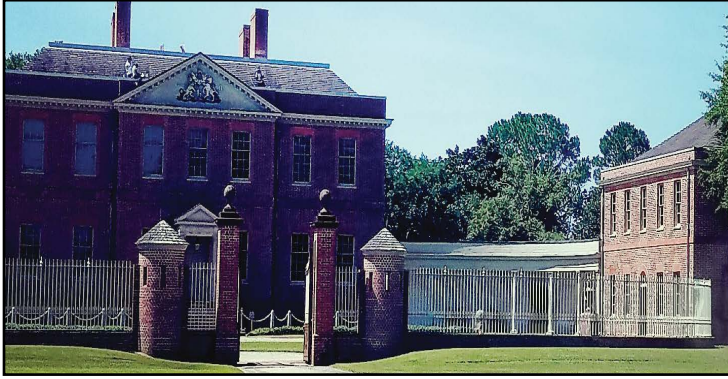
Through the scholarship fund, these students will be given an opportunity to begin, continue or finish their postsecondary education with Craven Community College or enhance a specific job skill through work force development.

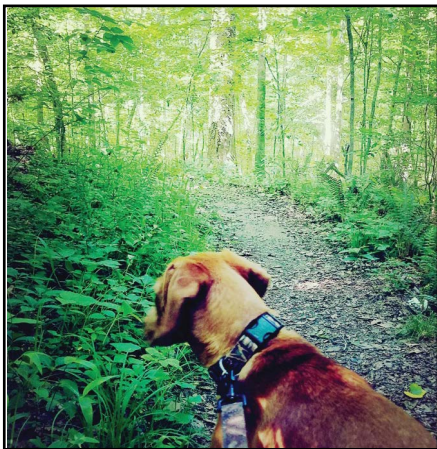
Nestled between the Neuse and Trent Rivers in Eastern North Carolina, New Bern is a haven for boaters, fishermen, and water sport fanatics. From large Marina's to off the path boat ramps, you'll find them here: [NCWildlife.org](http://NCWildlife.org).

Fishing is plentiful! Some of the water is brackish so you can catch both salt water and fresh water fish - you may need both licenses. For a unique outdoor experience, call [Spec Fever Fishing Guide Services](http://SpecFeverFishingGuideServices.com) (249-1520). Custom Marine Fabrication and Sports (638-5422) also has boating and fishing equipment. Neuse River Bait and Tackle offers classes and has a large assortment of fishing and outdoor equipment (745-0708).

Are you a boater? Join the New Bern Yacht Club (634-2626) or the New Bern Grand Marina and Yacht Club (638-0318). Do you prefer paddling? Contact Sound Rivers (637-7972) for paddle trail maps and details about boating and fishing on the Neuse and Trent Rivers along with their tributaries. You can also rent kayaks, stand up paddleboards, and take tours with Stand Up Outfitters (514-0404).

A "Nature Lover's Paradise", enjoy the Croatan National Forest. The forest's habitat has carnivorous plants like the Venus flytrap, pitcher plant, sundew, butterwort, bladderwort among other exotic plants. The Croatan spans approximately 160,000 acres and is located in New Bern's backyard. It's a sanctuary for black bear, deer, wild turkey, quail, coyote, bald eagle, beaver, bobcat, porcupine, American alligator, red-tailed hawk, and other wildlife you may see.

## Visit to the Hanna House Bed and Breakfast



The Hanna House prides itself in preparing superb breakfasts. Camille has always felt that the best way to start the day is with a hearty breakfast that will carry you late into the afternoon. Having a degree in Culinary Arts from Michigan and supported by her husband Joe, who was originally trained as a cook, a multitude of skill and caring went into the continuing development of their breakfast menus.

Our menu is composed of roughly 12 entrée choices that change with the seasons. We do this so we can incorporate the freshest local meats, dairy, and produce and to provide our repeat guests with new options.

Let's start a morning meal: Coffee is roasted from our own blend by a roaster formerly from New Bern, but now in Virginia. It is a mixture of French and Honduran beans, dark and deep, waking up your senses. Next, we serve juice, fresh squeezed orange is very popular, and a fruit: if local berries are ripe we will incorporate them in a sliced medley, or we may pan sear cantaloupe and drizzle a port wine reduction sauce over the top. Pears roasted in butter and topped with pistachios is another favorite.

Now for the entrée: Our new Spanish Frittata contains thinly sliced potatoes, egg infused with sautéed leek and a sausage mixture that includes chorizo, and Gouda cheese. This is topped with julienne strips of sweet red bell pepper and baked. Add to this a generous slice of our homemade sweet potato bread and your meal is complete. Eggs Benedict or Florentine, a spin on these two: Down Home Benedict, served with sausage gravy and country ham are just a few others. Not to worry, we will serve plain old oatmeal (well, not so plain) or scrambled eggs if you want and we do accommodate all dietary constraints: gluten free, vegan, etc. Let us know and your meal is designed for you alone.

Our Bed and Breakfast may be located in the central city, but our small back yard adds to your meal and afternoon and evening cakes and pastries. We care for bees, harvesting their honey for use on our table. Our pear tree provides lovely late summer fruit, our persimmon tree graces us with late fall fruit and our fig tree produces two crops: summer and fall of plump palette pleasers. Across the Neuse River, there are two blueberry farms from which we gather blueberries for the fruit cup and for our overnight pancakes. Travel up the road to White's farm and we collect fresh strawberries, raspberries and blackberries. Many of these find their way into the goodies we place on the front parlor table for our guests to munch on at their leisure: Ricotta pound cake, Irish soda bread with candied fruits, banana bread, and pear conserve cake, along with many others.

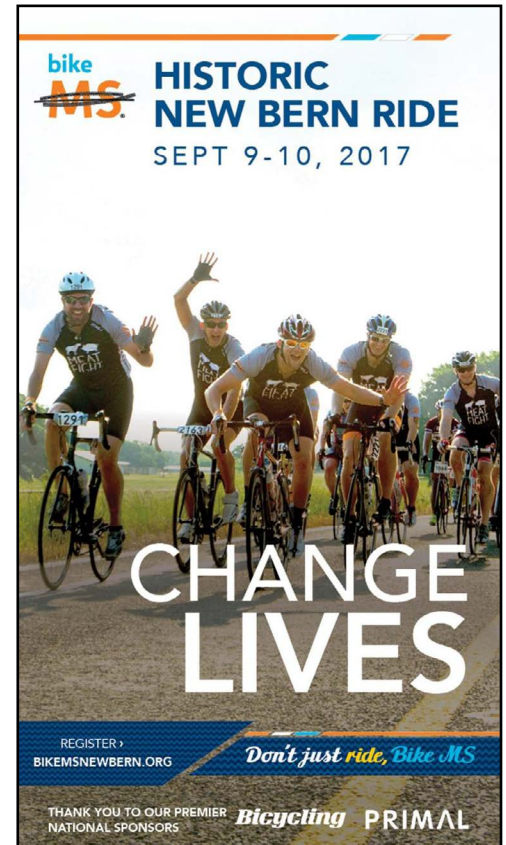

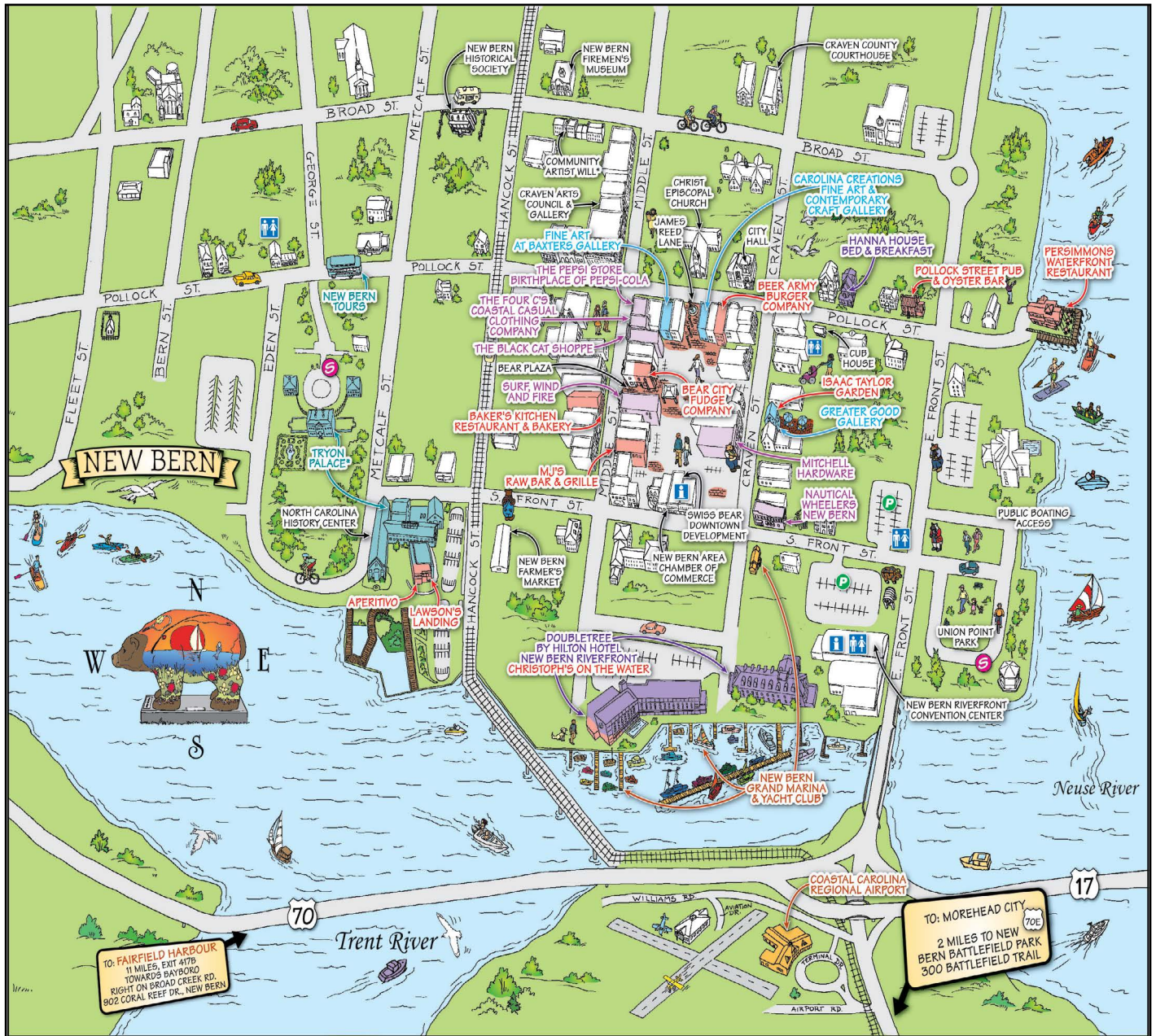

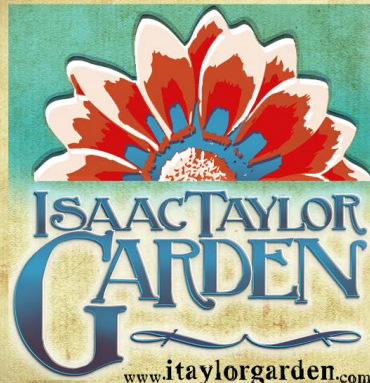
