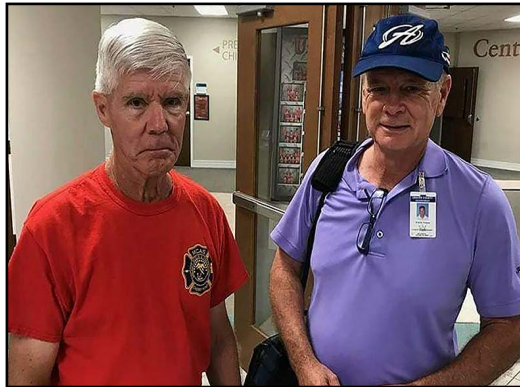

Hurricane Florence was a Monster. Many locals decided to stay because they've rode out countless storms. According to many lifelong residents, this was unlike any other. We're very thankful to the City of New Bern and Craven County workers for being as prepared as they could possibly foresee; weathering the storm; and working countless hours serving our community!

Most of us headed for higher ground when the mandatory evacuation was issued and if it wasn't for The City of New Bern, Craven County, Emergency Managers, the Coast Guard, and first responders; people would have lost their lives.

Who knows where we would be today without the planning and immediate response from our City and County as they assessed damages in the aftermath, set up and implemented protocols, and worked around the clock to rescue residents, restore power, clear debris and road hazards to ensure that those of us who evacuated, were able to return safely. They also did a terrific job fielding hundreds of calls from the National media!

So many people worked behind the scenes arranging for transportation of much needed food, water, clothing, and countless other supplies. This list of people is endless as people continue to recover.

There are countless stories of families, friends, neighbors, and strangers helping others cleanup, organize fundraisers, fill out paperwork, deal with insurance companies, or cope with loss. To me, this is what makes New Bern and Eastern North Carolina so special.

Some people dropped everything to help others. First responders rescued over 150 residents and transported them to Religious Community Services (RCS) and other agencies who set up shelters for not only people, but their pets. Despite the destruction and despair, I believe that together, our community will come out ahead of this **stronger than ever**.

Whether you heeded the warnings to evacuate or you decided to stay, we're back together. Through random acts of kindness, we can get to know each other.

Thousands of people in New Bern and surrounding areas are still suffering. Many have lost everything and some are homeless. From Brices Creek, Duffyfield, Fairfield Harbour, River Bend, Sunnyside, to Woodrow; people need help. The road to recovery may be a very long time for some people, so if you have the means, please consider lending a helping hand or making in kind or monetary donations.

Lodging is scarce so if you have a room to spare or a house to rent, please consider helping someone who needs a place to stay.

With so many people displaced and/or rebuilding, our community has come together to help their friends, neighbors, and strangers. We've heard this time and time again as people continue to organize food, clothing, and numerous other drives to fill needs in our community. When I say community, I'm referring to the greater New Bern area and surrounding towns who were impacted by the storm.

The outpouring of support from non-residents and those who have come from other States to help our community rebuild, truly reflects countless acts of kindness and the values that make us who we are as Americans.

As our town begins to rebuild, some seek a “silver lining” in the aftermath of destruction. It may be difficult to understand or think about right now, but history shows us that disasters pose an opportunity to start from a clean slate and/or rebuild stronger.

Some may scoff at the idea, but here's a couple examples of rebirth and renewal that have had a vital impact on our economy. Tryon Palace burnt to the ground in 1798 and although it wasn't rebuilt until the 1950s, fast forward to 2018 as hundreds of thousands of people visit Tryon Palace every year. The North Carolina History Center was built on a previous Brownfield property that was a major contaminant to the Neuse River and it now flourishes as an award winning “Green Designed Property”.

New Bern is a City of resilient people. If you're feeling helpless and don't think things can get any worse, imagine what it would be like to live through The Great Fire of 1922. The destruction left over 3,000 black families homeless on the day after Thanksgiving. Some of the survivors lived in “Tent City” in the summer heat and frigid winter for two long years.

In an article by David Cecelski, “Listening to History” in the News & Observer, Dorcas E. Carter recalled the day as **“The reason we made it: One struggle was everybody’s struggle”**. Although the fire happened a century ago, Ms. Carter's words ring true today as people from all walks of life came together to help each other. I believe it's a testament to the people of New Bern!

On another note, if you have been impacted, please register with FEMA. If you receive a denial letter, follow-up with them to make sure they have all the details. Once you register, you will be referred to the Small Business Administration (SBA) for homeowner/renter loan opportunity. If you're not eligible for a loan, they may refer you back to FEMA as you may be eligible for a grant. Deadline for FEMA and SBA registration is December 13. Register at [DisasterAssistance.gov](https://www.fema.gov/disaster/nc)

Although words and photos cannot begin to depict the sorrow and loss, we wanted to try to illustrate the strength, character, and resilience of the people of New Bern and Eastern North Carolina.

We wish we could personally thank everyone who stepped up prior, during, after, and those who continue to help in relief efforts. It's an endless list as our community recovers. For now, we will share images that were contributed by those who were there in the beginning and continue to help.

It's going to take time to rebuild, but I just wanted to reflect on the random acts of kindness. In these images, people may be devastated and/or displaced, but you'll see them smiling and even hugging, as **kindness and hope shines through**.

Discover our Past



Taken behind the North Carolina History Center

New Bern's history dates back to the 1580's when the Tuscarora Native American Tribe inhabited the area. It was officially founded in 1710 by Swiss Baron Christoph von Graffenried accompanied by Franz Ludwig Michel and Surveyor John Lawson.

During the American Revolutionary War, [Tryon Palace](#) was the first Colonial Capital building and later became North Carolina's First State Capitol. President George Washington attended a ball at Tryon Palace during his visit in 1792. Unfortunately, six years later, the main building and kitchen wing burned down.

Who knows what New Bern's economic and development landscape would be like today if it wasn't for Gertrude S. Carraway, Minette Chapman Duffy, Maude Moore Latham, May Gordon Kellenberger, Kate B. Reynolds, and Ruth Coltrane Cannon as they took on a 30 year challenge to restore Tryon Palace! In 1929, these women were determined to take on this formidable project. According to the [NC Department of Natural and Cultural Resources](#), "The path to gaining and excavating the Palace's complete site included moving a major highway and bridge, acquiring the one surviving colonial building, and relocating a neighborhood. Mrs. Latham and Mrs. Kellenberger further aided the cause with financial aid for constructing, landscaping, and furnishing much of the Palace."

Today, travelers from around the world visit Tryon Palace and the North Carolina History Center to enjoy a once in a lifetime experience that merges three centuries of history with modern technology enjoyed by all ages! (639-3500).

We also have numerous well-known residents that include: Richard Dobbs Spaight who signed the US Constitution; Kady Brownell, Civil War female soldier; James Davis opened the First Printing Press in North Carolina; Sarah Dudley Pettley, 19th Century Women's and Equal Rights Activist; Lula Disosway, Physician and Missionary; Bayard Wootten renowned 20th Century woman photographer; Charlotte Rhone, Nurse and Businesswoman; Walt Bellamy, Professional Basketball Player and Hall of Famer; Beverly Perdue became NC's First Female Governor; Nicholas Sparks, Novelist, Screenwriter, and Founder of the Epiphany School; Ella Bengel, First Woman Mayor, City of New Bern; Tommy Moore, Guinness World Record for the largest open faced BBQ bun as owner of Moore's BBQ, and the list goes on!

Explore our City's great history as there are so many landmarks to see and things to do!

Tryon Palace and the North Carolina History Center have numerous lectures and behind the scenes tours.

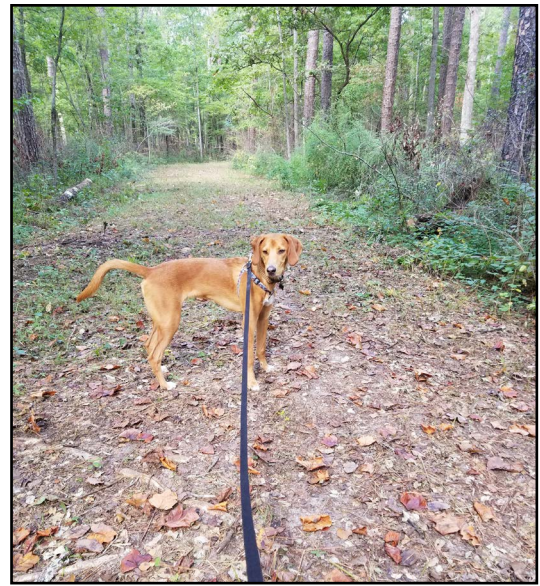
Camping:

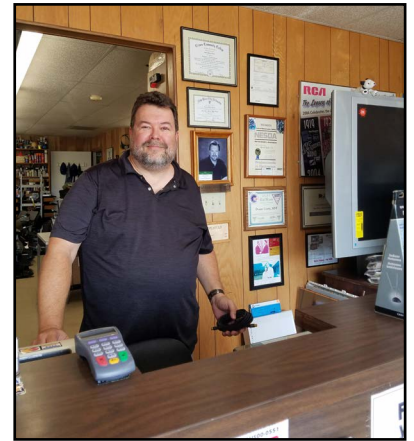

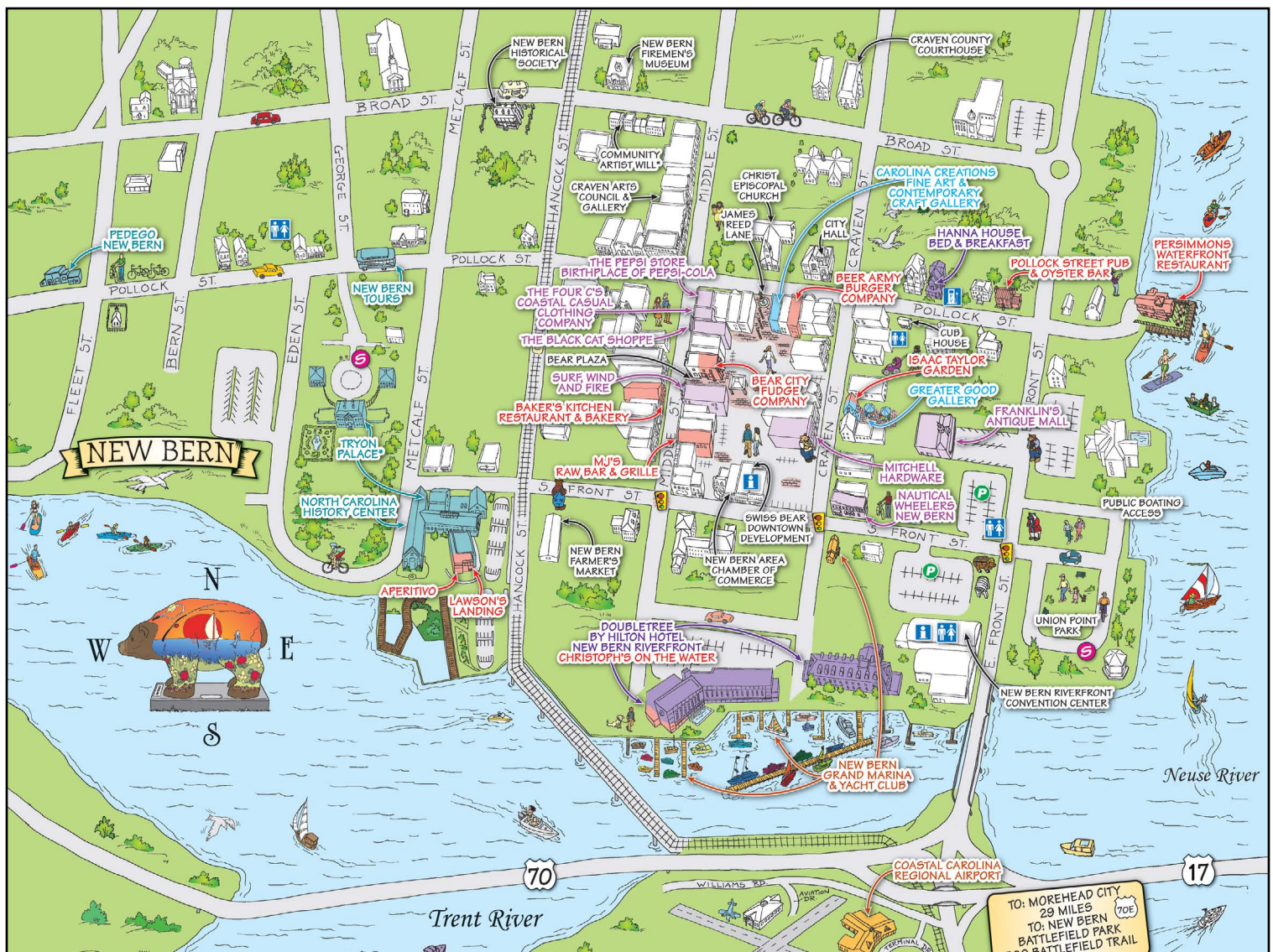

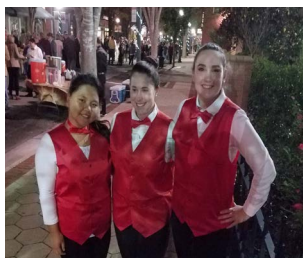
